

P. OTHER BUSINESS

Therefore be it resolved that Council directs staff to report to Council, with a timeline for implementation as soon as practically possible, on:

1. The implementation of an external surcharge or Township of Langley resident discount within the Fees and Charges Bylaw 4616 specific to recreation facilities with aquatics to assist with the significant net operating subsidies required from Township of Langley property taxpayers to provide these facilities to the Greater Langley population; and
2. Priority access registration for Township of Langley residents currently in place for swim lessons be extended to other high demand recreational programming, as it may be appropriate for Council to consider, including during the summer season at the Aldergrove Community Centre.

Further, that Council directs staff to review potential revised operating models in partnership with primary user groups for McLeod Athletic Park, Willoughby Community Park and the upcoming Smith Athletic Park and Ice Sheet and Dry Floor Arenas at the Langley Events Centre to help offset the net annual operating subsidies required for these current and future facilities for the Greater Langley population.

Councillor Ferguson presented the following Notice of Motion within the deadlines according to Council's policy:

10. Support Local and Canadian Businesses

Be it resolved that staff be directed to:

1. Amend the "Procurement Policy – Administrative" to purchase goods and services of Canadian origin whenever possible, keeping in mind cost and other considerations.
2. Actively continue to support Township of Langley and Canadian businesses.
3. Work with regional communities on initiatives that support local and Canadian businesses.

Councillor Pratt presented the following Notice of Motion within the deadlines according to Council's policy:

11. Surety Bond Program

Whereas:

1. Alternative forms of security for servicing agreements pursuant to the Township of Langley's Subdivision and Development Servicing Bylaw

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would provide for additional flexibility to help achieve housing mandates as dictated and required by the Province of British Columbia; and

2. The City of Surrey has implemented a Surety Bond Pilot Program with increasing demand to participate within, raising calls for the Township of Langley to consider the same;

Therefore be it resolved that Council directs staff to report to Council on alternative forms of bonding for servicing agreement security, such as a Surety Bond Pilot Program or other options it may be appropriate for Council to consider, pursuant to Subdivision and Development Servicing Bylaw No. 5382.
